






2024 YEPC Progress Result 2025 YEPC Courses Introduction





The International Peace Youth Group (IPYG), the world's largest youth organization operating in 128 countries, implements the Youth Empowerment Peace Class (YEPC), an informal peace education program designed to enhance the capabilities of young people.

YEPC provides youth with practical knowledge and a peace-oriented mindset to address key youth-related challenges.

Since it's launch in 2020, the program has engaged approximately 3,000 participants, and continues to introduce new educational content each year to reflect evolving youth-related issues.











The program blends practical skills with core peace values across a variety of educational courses.

Parenting Education

Supports young individuals who became parents early due to child marriage or conflict.

Youth Health Education

Raises awareness of drug-related risks and promoting mental and physical well-being.

Career Education

Equips young people with industry-relevant vocational skills to adapt to changing job markets.

Leadership Education

Explores the history of war, leadership, and youth engagement in peacebuilding.

Following these courses, participants engage in interactive assignments and peace campaigns to apply what they have learned.

Through YEPC, participants expand their expertise in diverse fields and recognize the role of youth in fostering sustainable peace.

The program encourages young people to **critically examine barriers to peace** and take **proactive steps toward resolution.**







YEPC empowers youth to become peace advocates, leading positive change within their communities and expanding their influence globally.

Furthermore, YEPC supports the achievement of Quality Education, one of the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), while contributing to UNESCO's vision for lifelong learning.










Results for YEPC in 2024



Youth Health Education

"First Aid Training"

- Recognize the importance of first aid in handling trauma and outdoor emergencies.
- Apply learned skills to daily life situations.

Participant Interviews

"The first aid training was very informative. As someone who suffers from low blood pressure, I often feel extremely cold, even in the hottest season. I learned how to keep warm and what essentials are needed to manage it. I also leaned how to use water bottles and prepare correct tea mixture to help regulate body temperature."



Youth Leadership Education

"The Solutions for Human Rights and World Peace in This Era"

- Gain an understanding of the historical background behind the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and its role as a practical model for the Declaration of Peace and Cessation of War (DPCW).
- Examine the evolving nature of conflicts in the 21st century and explored the solutions proposed by the DPCW.
- Recognize the necessity of global youth participation in achieving world peace.

"Lecture was informative. Engaging youths and mentioning war is good thing. People keep position and give us messages; we youths are being abused to go ahead and be front line of war. I am glad to have this kind of educational platform, it is going to help us a lot. A lot of young people do not have the opportunity to attend this kind of platform."

YEPC will commence its fifth term, introducing a new set of lessons.


Each year, YEPC develops new peace education content addressing current youth-related issues, enabling them to become advocates for development and peace in their communities and nations.



- Overcome misunderstandings that lead to extremism and religious violence by fostering a deeper comprehension of essential scriptural teachings, ultimately spreading a culture of peace.
